Dear Chairwoman Lowey and Ranking Member Granger:

We are writing to bring to your attention a matter of priority concern to institutions of higher education located in our districts that were recent denied ongoing federal funding for their students most in need of assistance under the federal TRIO program. We respectfully urge your support for COVID-19 supplemental appropriations to enable these institutions to continue to serve the interests of high-need students during this time of a pandemic and severe economic distress.

As you know, federal TRIO programs provide support for outreach and student services for people from disadvantaged backgrounds, to help them progress through the academic pipeline. This includes low-income and first-generation college students, and individuals with disabilities.

In August, the Department of Education decided to discontinue funding for the TRIO programs operated by a number of incumbent TRIO grantees. This decision came as a shock to these institutions. For years, the TRIO program has supported institutions' efforts to provide support services to students who are most in need of assistance. These institutions had no expectation that TRIO funding would be discontinued.

The Department of Education's decision to discontinue funding for TRIO programs operated by postsecondary institutions comes at an extraordinarily difficult time. While colleges and universities are dealing with the impacts of the pandemic, economic turmoil, and challenges with adjusting to new modes of instruction and student and faculty engagement, no one has been impacted more than TRIO students.

We respectfully urge you to support COVID-19 supplemental appropriations to enable incumbent TRIO program grantees whose TRIO funding has been discontinued by the Department of Education to continue to provide these essential services to students in need of assistance.
