Public Transit





1 in 10 transit vehicles in the state are currently past useful life. KS has been allocated \$49 million to improve public transportation in fiscal year 2022.



In the last decade, Kansas has experienced 39 extreme weather events, costing the state up to \$20 billion in damages.

- \$32 million has been allocated to Kansas in 2022 for weatherization.
- \$6.7 million to help prevent outages and make the power grid more resilient in 2022.
